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Speakers Announced for 2010 Ed Tech Business Forum

Conference to explore new business models for ed tech companies

Washington, D.C. (Oct. 19, 2010) – Industry leaders from key ed tech organizations will address the evolution of business models in the education technology industry at the 10th annual Ed Tech Business Forum, hosted by the Software & Information Industry Association (SIIA), Nov. 29-30 in New York City.

The theme for the Forum is “Re-Inventing Business Models” – a particularly relevant topic in a rapidly changing education ecosystem. In addition, the program will focus on the economic landscape for companies looking at financing options now, as well as future growth opportunities.

Featured on the schedule is a keynote address by **Harold Levy, managing director of Palm Ventures**. Mr. Levy concentrates on investments in education, regulated industries and allied fields. He was previously Executive Vice President and General Counsel of Kaplan, Inc. where he started Kaplan University's online School of Education. From 2000-2002, Levy was New York City Schools' Chancellor under Mayors Giuliani and Bloomberg. He started the much emulated Teaching Fellows Program for career changers, led a school system of 1.1 million children during the 9/11 attack and its aftermath, and presided over the largest one-year rise in math scores ever. Education Secretary Duncan recently appointed Mr. Levy as a member of the Committee on Measures of Student Success.
